I hope you have been enjoying the glorious Spring weather and the opening of our State after a very difficult year. Living in North Central has been a blessing. With easy access to our own nationally designated park, The Murphy Bridle Path, we are able to walk, bike and run under the beautiful ash and olive trees. It is exciting to see the new 55 ash trees that were planted last Fall, blooming and thriving. Soon they will be providing the much needed shade during our hot summer months. Thanks to you, we are leaving a legacy of trees for the next generation.

We are all experiencing the increase in population and hot real estate market here. Some developers are looking for ways to carve up our larger parcels for more density. The NCPHA's position has always been to oppose those lot splits that require variances or zoning changes. If you can divide it legally and without zoning alterations, then we show our support. But having to get multiple variances or changes to force those divisions, we carefully scrutinize. We are also seeing many people move out of different

areas of the City to North Central, because they love the charm, history and ambiance. Other neighborhoods have been ruined by overdevelopment, look-a-like McMansions and other cookie cutter housing styles. This is a good reminder to see if your neighborhood has Deed Restrictions or CC&Rs. Many of our North Central neighborhoods DO have deed restrictions that were written decades ago and have an auto renewal feature. We are discovering that they are still enforceable and may require some updating, but that can easily happen with the help of an attorney. If your neighborhood does NOT have deed restrictions, you may want to consider meeting with your neighbors and drafting some to ensure your property values. It's really the only way you can protect yourself from egregious development.

New Speed Limits on North Central Ave



The City of Phoenix recently reduced the speed limit on Central Avenue from Orange Drive (just north of Camelback Road) to Northern from 40 mph to 35 mph, as approved by the City Council.

Street Transportation crews replaced a total of 23 Speed Limit signs and installed temporary "New Traffic Pattern Ahead" signs to alert drivers of the change.

Let's all drive at 35 mph and enjoy the view of our beautiful North Central Avenue.

K9 Dennis "Took a Bullet" for His Team -

Last December, Officers responded to calls of shots fired. When they arrived at the scene, they found a man dead. During their search for the homicide suspect, they were directed to a nearby apartment. Upon entering the apartment an armed man fired, hitting a police K9 dog.

The K9 "Dennis" was rushed to a veterinary medical facility where he made a full recovery and returned to duty. Because of his heroic actions, the 6-year-old K9 saved the police officer's lives.

As many of you may recall from our NCPHA Facebook posts earlier this season, we were able to support the recuperation of Dennis, the Phoenix PD K-9 who was shot in the line of duty.

We are happy to report that Dennis has made a full recovery and he even paid a visit to Anne Ender's home with Officer Happeny to say thank you for the gift basket we sent him on behalf of our generous residents.



Following this incident, Phoenix PD made the decision to outfit all 14 K-9's with ballistic vests. Each vest costs nearly \$4000. The police department has been working with the non-profit K-9's of Valor to help their fundraising efforts to get all of their dogs outfitted with these vests. Tree Update -

Spring is officially here and summer is quick to follow. It's a wonderful opportunity to spend time outdoors enjoying our beautiful neighborhood! If you have experienced the Bridal Path lately, you may have noticed that it is a bit more green thanks to your gracious donations and the efforts of the City of Phoenix. Over 50 new ash trees have now been planted and the health of each existing tree has been noted with the intent to continue and replace as necessary. Additionally, the City has agreed to continue the pilot project of planting 5 to 10 additional trees each year strategically placed in between older trees to insure that our urban forest remains healthy and diverse in age.

As you may be aware, the City of Phoenix will be replacing water lines on the

east side of Central Avenue in the coming weeks. Rest assured that coordination efforts have taken place with the appropriate departments to ensure minimal damage to the existing, mature trees. However, due to the disruption no additional trees will be planted or replaced until the water line work is complete.

NCPHA is committed to continuing our efforts in maintaining and Beautifying North Central. As a reminder, the cost of purchasing, planting and maintaining a 24"box Ash tree is \$350. If you would like to contribute to the lasting success of this project, please note either trees or Beautify North Central along with your donation.

- 3) Are of an appropriate age to operate your class of vehicle
- 4) Aware of the vehicle's passenger capacity.
